# **Greetings from the Alberta Elks Foundation**



Your board has had a busy first half of the year and is pleased to report on our activities thus far. We began the year working at a casino in Calgary to raise the much-needed funds to assist our lodges through grants and to supply the funding for our projects. One of our first tasks was to address the trailer for our float as it was evident that the float required an enclosed trailer to prevent the road wear that was being inflicted with the open trailer. We were able to obtain a trailer at cost as well as having the dealership take ours in trade. Our thanks to Brad Biette for negotiating the purchase and seeing it through. We have since had the trailer wrapped with our branding and logos and it looks great. I am sure that the lodges will want to include the trailer in their parades as well as Charlie and the float itself.

We addressed the changes to our bylaws and regulations at our orientation meeting in September and tackled the idea of creating a brand and updating logos for the Foundation. Sister Kelly took on the task and through a lot of effort along with a few hiccups created a package that the Board approved for implementation. The package will be presented to you in the New Year for your use. We are very excited to present this to you and have already implemented it on our float as well as our newly created Brochure. That is another project that we have addressed and again Sister Kelly stepped forward and with some assistance has created a new brochure that is to go to print soon. The brochure design and upgrade was required as our old brochure was designed more for lodge information rather than for the general public. We now have a brochure that we can use at trade fairs and other events that will inform the public about what the Foundation is and what it is doing and has done. We are sure that it will be an aid that not only informs the public but can be used as a recruiting tool for new membership.

As indicated, we have created new and updated logos for the Foundation, Tabs for Tots, Mighty Lil' Elk, and the Toy Drive as well as creating a Branding design to be used on correspondence and advertising. Please visit the website to see these exciting logos and ideas.

We have upgraded the manual which is on the website and by doing so have included a description of all our programs as well as including the applications for all the grants to the programs. We hope that this will streamline the process for lodges to access the grants and understand the areas in which they can be used.

We made some changes in the Mighty Lil' Elks bags by eliminating the Visa card thus freeing up funds so that we can increase the number of bags produced this year and enabling access to them by individual lodges for their emergency services. The orders for the contents have gone out and we look forward to having them available in the New Year. In addition, we have developed a sponsorship program to hopefully access outside funding to support and sustain the program and possibly grow it to include the major hospitals in Calgary and Edmonton (the Children's Hospital and the Stollery). We have to thank Sister Kelly again for spearheading much of this.

Finally, the Board felt that it was vital that we supply the membership with current information on all of our programs and how to access them by having an article on each program rotate through the newsletter so that each month information on one program will be presented. We plan on continuing to present these on a rotating basis so that our members can be better informed of the workings of their Foundation.

# Personal Assistance Grant - how do we access it??

Please assure all individuals any information provided will remain confidential!!

- Grants up to \$2,000 can be applied for throughout the year. If the request exceeds \$2,000 (up to a maximum of \$5,000) will only be considered at the Annual General Meeting.
- The Lodge Charities Chair will conduct a complete investigation of the case. If a need is not seen, the application process does not proceed.
- A letter from a doctor or other medical professional giving a detailed estimate of cost, duration and confirmation of need of required assistance is required to be attached to the application.
- Can any part of the expenses be met from other sources such as medical plans or group benefits. Have they applied for funding from any other sources?
- If a supplier or professional people are involved, payment should be made directly to them. Obtain a receipt, receive confirmation of expenditures and send those copies to the Foundation Office.
- Travel and accommodation requests cannot be covered due to AGLC restrictions.
- It is advised that any requests for support from the Foundation should be submitted prior to committing any funds from your Lodge. If it is an emergency, telephone the Foundation Office.
- Please acknowledge the Alberta Elks Foundation for their contribution, whether it be publicly or to the recipient.
- Funding cheques will be made payable to the recipient and mailed to the Lodge for presentation.




Mannville Royal Purple Elks recognized four members with Honorary Life memberships. Their service years combined was more than 190 years! We are so grateful for for their contributions to the community.
