The Association has been hard at work on a number of initiatives aimed at strengthening our community connections and creating pathways for future success. Key highlights include:

• Membership Development:

- Developed a membership worksheet to explore unique marketing and outreach strategies.
- Identified at-risk lodges to provide additional support and guidance for sustainability.

Lodge Support and Community Engagement:

- Developed direct action plans for struggling lodges, including a mentorship program pairing Past Provincial Presidents and District Deputies to provide personalized support.
- Initiated a partnership with local media outlets to raise community awareness and build support for the lodges.
- Implemented monthly communications for updates and morale-boosting within the lodges, along with a commitment to share positive accomplishments across the association.
- Looking ahead, we're laying the groundwork for next year, ensuring that lodges in need of assistance receive ongoing support and that all lodges can continue their community work with renewed vigor. Our theme, "Invest in Us," is at the heart of these activities as we strengthen our foundation for the future.

INTERESTING FACT

A Walk Down Memory Lane

Did you know that the 1st Grand Lodge Convention was held in: Vancouver, BC; the 25th Convention was held in Flin Flan, MB; the 50th Convention was held in Calgary, AB; the 75th Convention was held in Winnipeg, MB. and the 100th was held in Chiliwack, BC.

At the 1926 Grand Lodge Convention it was passed that "it be compulsory for all members, on and after November 1, 1926, to wear the fez while the lodge is in session."

Up to 2006, the Grand Lodge Convention has been held:

- 23 times in BC
- 21 times in Alberta
- 18 times in Ontario
- 14 times in Saskatchewan

- 9 times in Manitoba
- 5 times in Quebec
- 2 times in Newfoundland 1 time in New Brunswick
- 1 time in the Northwest Territories
