W Key Highlights from the Meeting:

Programs & Grants

The Foundation reviewed ongoing programs and grant applications, reaffirming our commitment to supporting Alberta families and communities through initiatives like Tabs for Tots, Mighty Lil' Elks Kits, and Personal / Disaster Assistance Grants.

A new Tabs for Tots box sticker is also being developed to help unify and promote the program across the province! Alongside the launch of the 57th Annual Foundation Raffle, we are hoping for a sell-out!

💚 ATB Branches Across Alberta Collect Over 820 lbs of Tabs for Tots! 🖧 🌟



Across Alberta, ATB Financial branches have shown what community spirit truly looks like — joining together in support of the Alberta Elks Foundation's Tabs for Tots program, which funds pre-natal and pediatric medical equipment in rural hospitals.

This spring, Anna Staughton from the Bow Island ATB branch launched a friendly "Tabs for Tots Challenge" between ten southern Alberta branches. Together, they collected an incredible 757.2 pounds of aluminum tabs, with the Taber Branch leading the way at 378.6 lbs! A special thank-you goes out to Robert Cressman and the Taber Curling Club, who contributed tabs in memory of Robert's brother — a touching reminder of the heart behind this effort.

Not to be outdone, ATB branches in Breton, Drayton Valley, and Thorsby added another **64.4 pounds** of tabs over the past two months, bringing the total to more than 820 pounds collected provincewide!

The Alberta Elks Foundation extends heartfelt thanks to Anna Staughton and all participating ATB teams for their enthusiasm, teamwork, and generosity. Your efforts will directly support children and families across Alberta — proving once again that **Together We Can** make a difference!

That's where the Mighty Lil' Elks Kits come in!

These thoughtful care packages are designed to bring comfort and essentials to families facing medical emergencies away from home.

Each kit includes:

A phone charger

A self-care travel package

🔨 A brush and toothbrush

🥉 A cuddly stuffed toy for the child

Every January, our Elks volunteers assemble these special kits, which are then distributed to hospitals in Medicine Hat, Lethbridge, Red Deer, and Grande Prairie — with more locations added each year!

Each kit costs just \$33 and can be ordered directly through the Alberta Elks Foundation.

 Used to purchase pediatric items for hospitals that are not provided by Alberta Health Care





General Grant

- Applications up to \$2,000 can be applied for all year
- Any application up to \$5,000 must be approved by the general membership at Conference
- The Lodge must at least match the funds being requested
- AGLC have changed their rules and Lodges can apply for funding for their building if it is used by the community as well

- Personal Assistance Grant
 The Lodge Charities Chair must conduct a complete
 - · A letter from a medical professional must be included with the application
 - . Payment will be made directly to the suppliers or professional people
 - . Travel and accommodation requests cannot be supported as per AGLC rules
 - Forward your completed application form to the Foundation Office prior to committing Lodge dollars





Disaster Assistance Grant

- In the event a family's principal residence had a fire in your community, contact the Foundation Office via telephone
- A cheque in the amount of \$500, made out to the family, will immediately be sent to your Lodge for presentation
- Your Lodge does not have to match this amount, but it is suggested, if possible, that you contribute
